

## Easter Story Egg Hunt

### Materials Needed:

Plastic eggs

Treats for the eggs

Paper for printing Easter Story Pictures *or* for writing the story scene titles.

### Directions:

1) Print one set of Easter story pictures per child. Cut out the pictures, then fold them so they fit inside of plastic Easter Eggs.

\*ALTERNATIVE: If not able to print the pictures, write on squares of paper the following scene titles:

- Jesus rides into Jerusalem.
- Jesus eats with his disciples.
- Jesus prays in the Garden.
- Jesus is betrayed and arrested.
- Jesus is crucified on a cross.
- Jesus rose again on the third day.

2) Place treats in some eggs and the story pictures in others, then hide the eggs around your house or yard.

3) Have your child watch the **Easter Story Egg Hunt** video before they hunt for the eggs. The video will indicate when to hunt for the eggs. Be prepared to pause the video when prompted. (Note: The video will be linked in the Sunday Newsletter)

4) When the story pictures have all been found, have your children put the pictures in the proper order on the story sheet. If multiple children are playing you may need to make sure each child has the proper events for the story.

5) Begin playing the video again. The video will reveal the correct order and tell the Easter story.
